The latest with Legacy Parks

On September 27 we hosted more than a thousand local visitors for the Legacy Parks annual luncheon. This was a great opportunity to share our campus with many who had never visited (and some who didn't even know we exist!).

During the luncheon, an announcement was made that **we are exploring the feasibility of a partnership with Legacy Parks to develop some of our campus's natural resources.** Two possible projects include development of our trail system on the west side of Hodges Ferry Road (behind the new Athletic and Recreation Complex) and development of our river accessibility for kayakers. These projects would allow us to welcome the community so you can enjoy the natural beauty of our campus.


Of these two projects, the trail system seems the first and most likely to be implemented. Up to eight miles of multi-use trails for families, hikers, joggers, and bikers are possible. There are no plans to develop a trail system along the waterfront or to connect to any other trails.

Safety, of course, is a high priority. Part of our feasibility study will include learning best practices from other universities that have similar public access features.

We hope to become a destination where you and your family can bike, hike, and enjoy God's creation. We will share more details as plans are finalized!
