Quality is very important to our visual identity as a school. It is essential to put our best foot forward with our typography, which is the most important element of design.

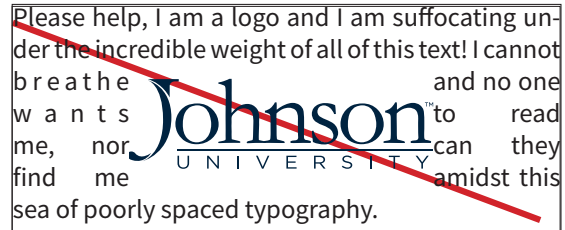
Can I use this font I found on the internet?

Do not rotate the logo



Do not crowd the logo



Do not edit, recreate, or add to the logo in any way



Do not stretch the logo



Do not put logo on busy background



Do not use low resolution logos from the internet



Do not change logo colors



Do not add a border to the logo

WHEN TO USE IT

- Whenever possible: this is the preferred logo type
- Whenever a space requires width to fill



Condensed

WHEN TO USE IT

- When the landscape logo is not suitable
- When there is not sufficient space for landscape

Logos are organized by type and then color.

The FL landscape logo in full color would be labeled like so:

Why are there no white .JPG logos?

A white logo requires a transparent background. PNG and AI support transparency, JPG does not. For this reason, making a white JPG is not possible.

Why are there no full color logos for GEN and TN?

GEN and TN logos only have navy in them (exception: TN has orange in its landscape logo), so they do not need a full color version. The main version is in the navy folder.
